Since August 2012, the Georgia PHP has provided services for physicians, physician assistants and respiratory therapists licensed in Georgia. In 2022, we began serving licensed veterinarians in Georgia as well.

The Georgia PHP is sponsored by the Georgia Composite Medical Board and the Georgia Board of Veterinary Medicine and maintains an active relationship with these organizations to ensure the success of the Georgia PHP and its participants.



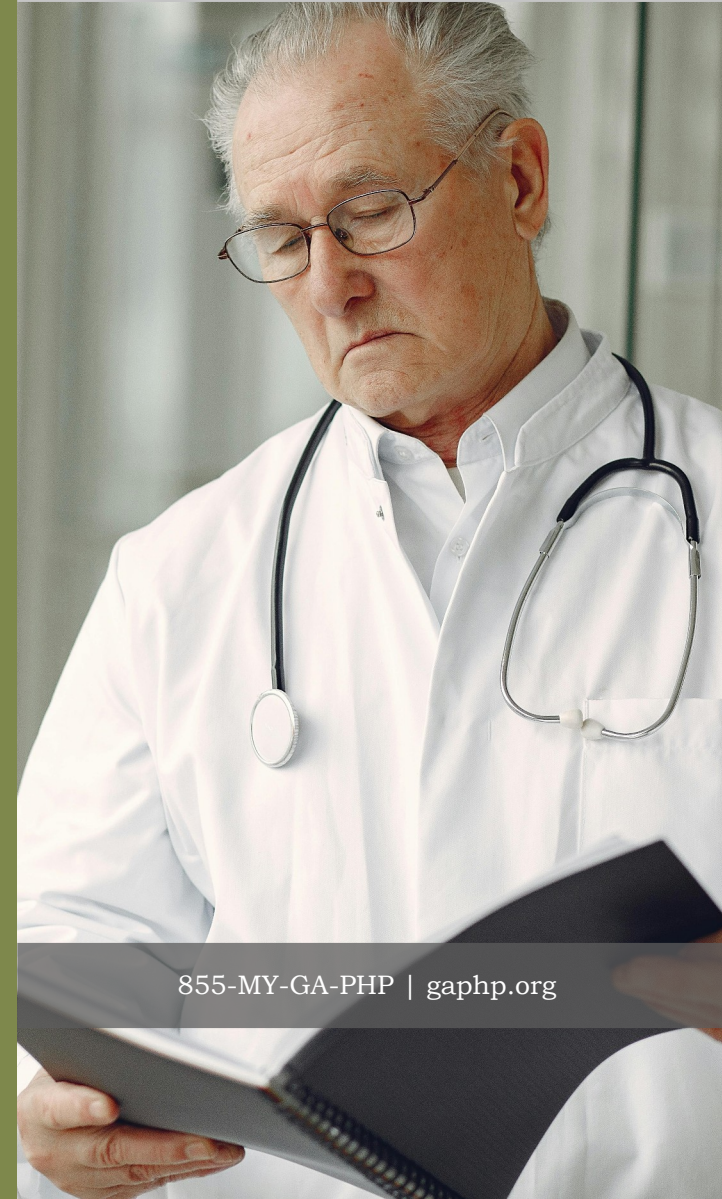

- To **Educate** concerned parties, such as hospitals, medical associations, boards, and malpractice carriers about mental health and substance abuse issues among Georgia healthcare and veterinary professionals.
- To promote **Prevention** and early detection of these conditions through lectures, seminars, and other training venues.
